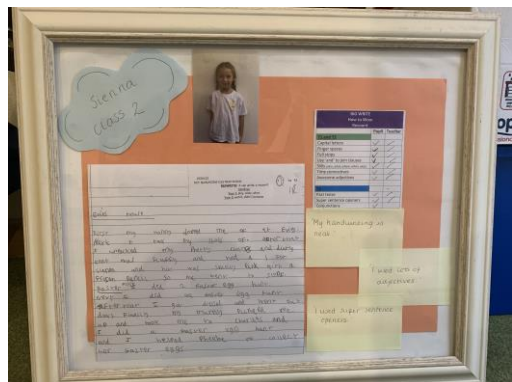

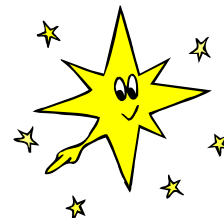

“On Wednesday 8th June, thirteen of us from year 5 and 6 went to County Athletics to compete for individual medals. This competition was in Redruth at Carn Brea Athletics Track. We each took part in three events and either did a heat, a heat then a final or straight forward final. In the end we won 17 medals; 11 golds including a team, 3 silvers and 3 bronze including a team.” By Mia

“Once we finally got there I had to wait a little while until it was my first race, then I had to do my sprint. I was nervous because I did not know how fast anyone was so when the gun shot I sprinted so fast I felt like the Flash and I won! Thirty minutes later I did the speed bounce and my score was 63 in 30 seconds which I won a gold medal for. Later that day it was the finals. The race started and I had a bad start but I still sprinted as fast as I could but I only came in 4th place.” By Jago

“After I arrived at Carn Brea, it was a bit of a wait until it was my race and I was doing the 600 metres. They called for year 5 boys and I walked over, trying to save energy and lined up in my lane. They blew the whistle twice, which means ready, set and then they shot the gun to go and we were off! I was in second trying to keep apace and then I was in first place but my shoes started slipping and I ended up in 4th place. After I lost that race out of 6 people I knew I had to step up my game so in the long jump I came 1st with 302cm and I got a gold medal so I was happy with myself. Then Stan, Jacob, Jensen & I came 3^d in the relay and got a bronze medal each. I was really proud of myself and on the journey home I was jumping with joy!” By Lewis
